

COMMITMENT: OUR EMPLOYEES

Young people are discovering our careers at McClean Lake in Canada

Orano in Saskatchewan encourages the recruitment of employees living in the communities in the north of the province near the McClean Lake mill site.



Orano Canada's aim is twofold: to secure recruitment needs, whilst equally playing a positive role in terms of local socio-economic activity. A major training program was deployed between 2012 and 2018: of the 91 young people trained, 80 were hired at the McClean Lake mill.

Today, a new program is in place to enable young people from the Athabasca Basin communities to familiarize with the profession of Environmental Technician.

At the end of a one-year practical training period, the apprenticeship continues in a technical institute to validate the environmental diploma. During this time, the apprentice is also taken on by the McClean Lake site for an internship or seasonal work.

The McClean Lake site currently has 11 employees devoted to environmental monitoring and taking water, air, and soil samples from more than 300 locations around the site. The job ideally suits those who love the outdoor life, as is the case for
